Problem Gambling in Youth & Young Adults

Approximately, 2.1% to 2.6% of North American youth have a gambling problem [1-2]. Few high school students in Illinois report gambling (1% to 5%), however, discussions with Illinois youth and other Illinoisans suggest that problem gambling among youth may be a growing concern [3].

An estimated 3.8% of Illinoisans have a gambling problem. An additional 7.7% of Illinoisans are at-risk of developing a gambling problem.

- While Illinois young adults similarly reported lottery (60.8%) and gambling with friends or in the community (53.3%) as the most popular forms of lifetime gambling, they were the age group with the highest prevalence of lifetime online gambling (33.4%).
- At the individual level, youth who are impulsive, sensation-seeking, or have poor coping strategies may be at higher risk for developing a gambling problem [4-5].
- The surrounding environment also plays a role in youth problem gambling, with poor family cohesion, neighborhood disadvantage, and gambling availability & marketing being associated with higher risk

- Community discussions with youth also highlighted the growing concern of the availability of gambling opportunities at local grocery stores, gas stations, and mobile games/e-sport applications

Youth from community discussions highlighted micro transactions in readily

accessible free-to-play games as *"overly predatory"*.

 Illinois young adults were the most likely to say they would not seek help for a gambling problem (9.0%)
