MAR has a strong research base and is proven effective in reducing recidivism and death due to overdose for incarcerated individuals with opioid use disorder. Currently most illicit drugs, such as methamphetamine, also contain fentanyl, an especially potent and dangerous form of opioid. Jails making MAR available to detainees with substance use disorders greatly reduce their legal liability risk for failure to provide this treatment, while also improving the jail environment and outcomes for detainees, the jail, and the county.

Who Should Attend? Sheriffs, custody, clinical and administrative jail leadership and staff interested in learning about MAR program design and implementation in their county jail. All interested persons are welcome.

The agenda will include information on the topics below and allow time to talk with your counterparts from other counties to share current challenges and solutions.

- **Risk and Cost Mitigation:** MAR Implementation to decrease legal liability for the jail and county and reduce recidivism and costs.
